## KCET-TV Interview of Legendary Armenian Filmmaker Gets Extended Coverage

(Thousand Oaks, CA) April 26, 2006 - A recent interview by KCET of J. Michael Hagopian is getting high profile attention from the local Public Broadcasting Service station. Hagopian, legendary producer/director/writer and co-founder of the Armenian Film Foundation in Thousand Oaks, was interviewed in April at his office by KCET "Life & Times" anchor Val Zavala. A segment of that interview was initially aired April 19. It is scheduled for a re-run in the greater Los Angeles area Friday, May 12 at 6:30 p.m.

The broadcast, as well as other footage from the original two-hour interview, has been placed in the "Life and Times" section of the KCET website at *www.kcet.org*. The means are also in place to visit other pertinent websites via their **Related Resources & Links** section. And, site visitors can participate in "blogging", a relatively new technology that allows "bloggers" to write and add their comments to an on-line "diary" that can, in turn, be read and responded to by others. Hagopian was asked to write about his 50-year journey and goal as an independent filmmaker for the beginning of the Blog portion of the site. The 92 year old internationally award-winning legend concluded his response by writing, "I feel that my work is important because I want the truth to be known about the Armenian Genocide [of 1915]. I want the justice accorded to Armenians to be a reminder to the world that future acts of violence committed against humanity will not be tolerated by the international community." No doubt Armenians worldwide echo his sentiment year-round, but especially at this time of the 91<sup>st</sup> commemorative year of the Genocide.

In continuing efforts to deliver that poignant message, Hagopian is currently working on the 'crown jewel' of THE WITNESSES trilogy of full-length documentaries on the Armenian Genocide. This third and final film of the trilogy, *Caravans Along the Euphrates*, tells the story of that horrific period in Armenia's history in large part with the testimonies of its eyewitnesses.
